off with opening act firefighter Joe Perez, who danced to "Girls Just Want to Have Fun."

His sparkly blue bra went for \$1,300.

"I'm just glad I could warm the crowd up and get some money to fight breast cancer," he said.

The purchasers of the bra, Shanon McIntush and Doreen Fisher, said they bought it because they believed in the cause.

"We are committed to the support of women enduring the burden of a breast cancer diagnosis," Fisher said.

"We're happy to give to a cause that helps women, and this one helps women diagnosed with breast cancer, which is even better," McIntush said.

This year's performance also featured former Broadway performer and local New Braunfels resident Easton Smith. This was Smith's first time participating as a model in the event.

"I work out with somebody who is a chair for Bras for a Cause at cross fit, and she asked one morning if I would dance for bras," Smith said. "I think what's incredible about this event is the amount the community comes together to pull for other people in the New Braunfels community."

Smith also offered two free tickets to whoever bid on his bra to a performance at the Tobin Center of the Nutcracker, which he and his wife choreographed this year.

"The audience was so receptive," Smith said. "It takes me back to the days I used to perform all the time and it makes me miss the things that I love, which is performing in front of an audience, especially with this cause it has this dual purpose too which is great."

Smith's Kiss-themed bra went for \$7,000.

Another dancing participant, firefighter Nick Bautizta, said he participates because cancer is an issue close to his heart.

"It goes back locally to my son who is 18 and a cancer survivor, so that's why I do it," Bautizta said. "He was diagnosed with leukemia and he's survived cancer, so to give these other people a chance, it's a great blessing."

Still, the pre-stage nerves get to him, Bautizta said.

"I look for my wife

when up there dancing, it makes it so much easier," Bautizta said. "I know exactly where she's at, and I just look for her."

In an on-the-spot decision, the auctioneer, Ryland Shea, also got auctioned after the women in the crowd started chanting for him to dance. It was completely unplanned, he said.

"I did have a part in the auction, but to sell myself, that was 100 percent on the fly, and it shocked me as much as it did everybody else. But I was happy to do it," Shea said.

Not wearing a bra, he instead offered to take whomever "bought him" out for breakfast the next morning.

After selling for \$1,500, Shea said "Y'all want to know something funny? My aunt was the one who bought me."

Leigh Fetters, a volunteer working the event's

T-shirt stand, said this is her second year to volunteer, and she loves the event.

"If you want to help someone financially, and have a tremendous time doing it, you'll laugh your head off and you will cry," Fetters said.

It's also great that the money goes back to helping local women, Fetters said.

"Pink Warrior Angels in particular is amazing," Fetters said. "It benefits so many people, and the money does stay local. That's really why I wanted to be a part of it."

Wild said she was extremely pleased with the way the event went, and she's already thinking about next year's fundraiser.

"People continue to amaze me, I just don't know how we're going to surpass this next year," Wild said.

from the ministry during an investigation recommended by the Archdiocesan Review Board, the written statement said. Archbishop Gustavo Garcia-Stiller opened the investigation.

"Following review of the outcome of the investigation, the Archdiocesan Review Board advised the archbishop earlier (Friday) that there is sufficient evidence that the abuse occurred to refer the matter to the Congregation of the Doctrine of the Faith at the Vatican for possible laicization," it said. "Because of this, Archbishop Gustavo removed Rev. Pavlicek's faculties today and prohibited him from exercising any priestly ministry."

Church officials are not releasing details about the alleged assaults or information that might compromise the anonymity of the person who reported the allegations, said Jordan McMorrough, director of communications for the Archdiocese of San Antonio.

"We'd rather not talk about the gender at this time. The person that came forward wishes to remain anonymous," he said. "Those details regarding the specifics of the case we're not disclosing at this time."

The alleged abuse victim contacted someone on Aug. 29 at the Archdi-

ocese's Office for Victim Assistance and Safe Environment and reported the allegations against Pavlicek, who last served as pastor at St. Thomas the Apostle Church in Canyon Lake. On Aug. 30, the Archdiocese notified the Bexar County District Attorney's special crimes division personnel of the allegations.

The church's canonical investigation ended Thursday with the help of an independent private investigator, the news release said.

Pavlicek began July 1 as pastor at the Canyon Lake church. He has had several previous assignments at Catholic institutions in places like Schertz, Marion, San Antonio and others.

"This was the first allegation of child sexual abuse involving Rev. Pavlicek that the Archdiocese has received," the news release said. "Archbishop Gustavo would like to publicly express his gratitude to the survivor for bravely coming forward and helping the Archdiocese by sharing these deeply personal and painful experiences. He hopes that this will also assist the healing process, and provide inspiration to other survivors of sexual abuse to report to the authorities these tragic incidents."

Church leaders said in the statement that the Archdiocese will contact members of St. Thomas the Apostle and other


parishes where Pavlicek worked.

In the written statement, the Archdiocese encouraged any other victims to come forward and contact law enforcement. It also asked victims within the Archdiocese to contact the Office for Victim Assistance and Safe Environment at 210-734-7786.

"The Archdiocese of San Antonio takes seriously any allegation of child sexual abuse," the statement said. "The safety and well-being of all people are very important to the Archdiocese, and the church's safe environment policies seek to protect all of God's children."

No one with information at the district attorney's office could be reached for comment late Friday afternoon. A woman who answered the telephone at St. Thomas the Apostle referred all calls to the Archdiocese.
